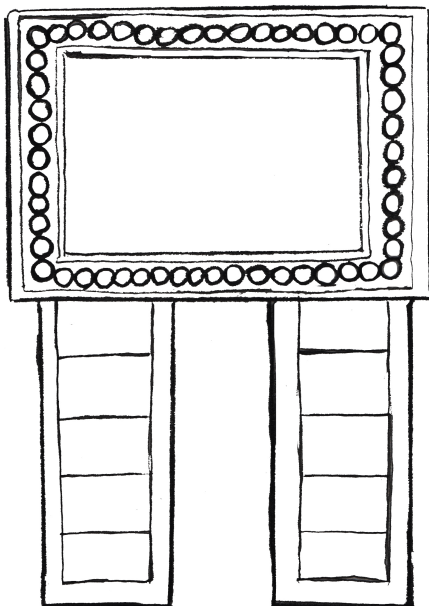
For our first activity,

you like!



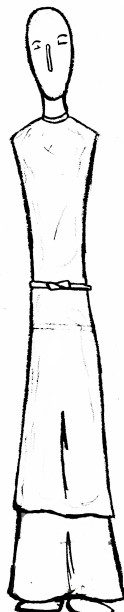
1. The Good Samaritan
